We have three Bullie ladies in rescue right now that need homes. The first is Emmy Lou. Emmy Lou is a lovely seven year old Bulldog that is in good health and is a real sweetie. However, her current owner's job requires her to travel a lot and it is getting harder for her to give Emmy Lou the attention she deserves. Emmy Lou gets along with cats and tolerates other dogs, but isn't keen on playing with them. She prefers the attention of humans to other dogs.

Her former owner had died and the surviving family members did not want to deal with Daisy or her mother and both were turned into the St. Paul Humane Society. Her foster family called our rescue group hoping we could find a good Bulldog-experienced family for Daisy and we agreed to handle her adoption. Daisy will be going to a "meet and greet" soon. If that goes well, Daisy may have found herself a new family to love.

Gilda is eight years old and has not had the best of care. She had been used in the past as a brood bitch for many years by a questionable breeder. She was surrendered to rescue because her owner said that Gilda was depressed and would not eat for her. However, Gilda had never been to a vet to see if there was a physical cause for her lack of appetite. Interestingly enough, her foster mom, Sandy says that she has had a good appetite and has gained quite a bit of weight already in just the short time she's been with her.



Gilda was extremely thin when she first came into foster care. She will remain in foster care until we have a better handle on her medical issues. Gilda is quite timid, and appears to have been physically abused at some point in her life judging from her physical reactions to certain stimuli. She gets along OK with the dogs in her foster home, but would probably appreciate a quiet home with another dog that is also on the quiet side.
